The successful candidate will provide AOG support, perform scheduled and unscheduled inspections, and carry out aircraft repairs as needed. You will be primarily supporting operations involving Piper Navajos, Beech King Air, and turbine and piston engine aircraft.

This contract position is located in Thunder Bay (YQT). Shifts are generally Monday-Friday, 8am to 4PM. Must be able to work evenings, weekends, and on-call as required with possible night shifts.

Required

- Certification as an Aircraft Maintenance Engineers, M1 and M2 license required together with a minimum of 3-years' experience
- Piston, Rolls Royce 250 and PT6 turbine engine experience.
- Large Transport Category aircraft experience.

- Experience in maintaining Air Tractor, Cessna Caravan, Cessna 206, Beech King Air, Piper Navajo aircraft.
- Superior organizational skills.
- Avionic license is an asset.
- Effective verbal and written communication skills, including proficiency with MS Word, and Excel.
- Experience with customer service and client communication.
- Strong leadership and mentorship skills, including the ability to direct, motivate, evaluate and recognize staff; proven ability to share skills and knowledge with others.
